What was life like when our Association was in it's formative years?

Just imagine, one hundred years ago, what a difference a century makes!

Here are some of the statistics for that year: The average life expectancy in the U.S. was 47 years.

- Only 14 percent of the homes had a bathtub.
- Only eight percent of the homes had a telephone.
- A three minute call from Denver to New York City cost eleven dollars. Think about what a call costs now!
- There were only 8,000 cars in the U.S. and 144 miles of paved roads.
- The maximum speed limit in most cities was 10 mph.
- Most women only washed their hair once

a month, and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.

- The average wage in the U.S. was 22 cents per hour.
- Sugar cost four cents a pound.



- Eggs were fourteen cents a dozen.
- Coffee was fifteen cents a pound.

But remember, you were only making 22 cents an hour so it was all relevant!

Just imagine what life must have been like back then.

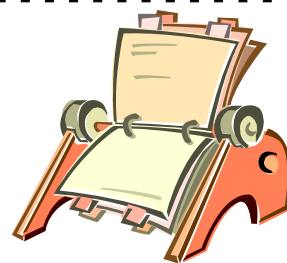
